Postcard Art Swap

Invite friends to join you for this postcard swap. Choose the number of people who will join, send them each a list of addresses and a deadline, and then create a batch of postcards to send off and swap. Then wait for little parcels to arrive in your own mail.

- Watercolor paper
- Paint, brushes, water, rag
- Collage papers
- Glue
- Permanent marker
- Stamps









PREP

- Find out what the standard size is for postcards where you live., and cut paper to size. Our postcards are 4" x 6", and we got 3 pieces from one sheet of watercolor paper.
- Send a copy or version of the Postcard Art Swap Invitation from the next page to whoever you'd like to invite to your postcard swap.

PROMPT

• "Let's make postcards to send to our friends, and invite them to send postcards to us."

STEPS

- Set up paper on a painting surface.
- If you'd like to make a layered postcard like these, first paint. When the paint dries, add collage papers with glue. When that dries, draw on top with permanent pen or other drawing tools.
- Be sure to add extra glue on top of loose paper so it doesn't get caught in mail machines.

EXTEND IT

• Save your stamps and try this with your neighbors. Each person makes cards and drops them directly into neighboring mailboxes.
